Artists In Residence

Professional artists from the Gold Canyon Arts Council's Leland Wilson School Art Project worked with students in Allison Baumann's 7th & 8th grade art classes at Cactus Canyon Junior High School in Apache Junction during the weeks of April 26-29 and May 2-6.

This year's Artists in Residence are Dr. Mary Stokrocki, a Professor Emerita of Art Education at ASU and Kathy Mitchell, a retired art teacher and professional watercolor artist, are teaching a weaving class to students in Mrs. Baumann's class. For eight years, Leland Wilson Artists in Residence projects have been presented at Desert Vista Elementary School, Peralta Elementary School, Apache Junction High School, and in the schools on the San Carlos Apache Reservation.

To introduce the residency, Dr. Stokrocki presented a power point slide show on the history and types of weaving. She brought an Iranian woven carpet to show the students and discussed with them the symbols depicted in the woven carpet. The students began by drawing a simple design on paper to be used for their pattern. The students were given a 9" x 12" cardboard loom and were instructed how to warp their looms.

Throughout the week, the master teaching artists demonstrated different techniques, assisted the students in problem solving and completing their woven tapestries. A nice way to wrap things up, the last day of the weaving class, Mrs. Baumann enlisted a guest speaker, Velma Kee Craig, a Navajo weaver to come to the class and discuss the art of Navajo weaving.

The students in Mrs. Baumann's class were enthusiastic and eager to learn something different and to interact with these professional artists. It was a rewarding and delightful experience for both the artists and students.

The Gold Canyon Arts Council thanks Ken Deloera, Principal of Cactus Canyon Junior High School, and art teacher Allison Baumann for inviting these artists into the school. We would also thank the Artists of the Superstitions for donating the yarn for this weaving class. We look forward to working with the students next school year.

The Gold Canyon Arts Council, in addition to this visual arts program, presents inschool concerts, master classes, workshops and guitar lessons to hundreds of students in Pinal, Gila and eastern Maricopa counties. The Arts Council also donated arts supplies during the recent COVID Pandemic. All programs are presented free of charge. More information may be found on the Council's webize at: goldcanyonarts.org.



2022-2023 Canyon Sounds Series



John O'Conor, Concert Pianist November 18 & 19, 2022

Through his recitals, concerto appearances and critically acclaimed recordings, the Irish pianist John O'Conor has earned a reputation as a masterful interpreter of the Classic and Early Romantic piano repertoires. He has been praised for his formidable technique, mastery of keyboard color, and in particular his unique sound. He has been called a true 'Poet of the Piano'.

Prof. O'Conor is regarded as one of the most important concert artists and piano teachers in the world today. He is Distinguished Artist in Residence, Professor of Music and Chair of the Piano Division at Shenandoah Conservatory in Virginia, International Visiting Artist of the Royal Irish Academy of Music and Visiting Professor at Showa University in Japan. He will present a Friday evening concert and on Saturday, a masterclass and a lecture recital in cooperation with the Arizona Piano Institute.

The members of the Folk Legacy Trio are George Grove, formerly with the **Kingston Trio** for 41 years, Rich Dougherty, former member of the **Limeliters** and **Kingston Trio** for 25 years and Jerry Siggins, former lead singer of **The Diamonds** for 27 years.

The Black Market Trust is an American traditional pop/vocal Jazz group from Los Angeles who combine the sounds of the legendary American crooners and vocal groups with the fire and energy of Gypsy Jazz guitarist Django Reinhardt.
