After graduation he taught elementary, junior high and high school band, elementary, junior high, and high school choir. He has directed church choirs, community choirs, and community bands.

Currently John performs in Agape Brass Quintet, East Valley Pops Orchestra, and the Gold Canyon United Methodist Church choir, and conducts the Dolce Vita Sweet Life Singers.

John started working with the Gold Canyon Arts Council as a liaison with the council and the Apache Junction Schools, not long after the group was organized. GCAC History (an excerpt from Jack's article in the Canyon Sounds brochure)



As we near the conclusion of the 25th season (2021-2022) of the Gold Canyon Arts Council, it is only appropriate that we pause for a moment to reflect on the accomplishments of the past 24 years. The first four-part Canyon Sounds season began in August 1997. The founding group consisted of Jack, his wife Sara, and nine like-minded community members who would assess the community's interest in establishing a concert season in Gold Canyon. The initial concert was a choral concert titled "Children of the World in Harmony".

As we conclude 25 seasons, including last year's Virtual

Concert Season, we have many impressive statistics that may surprise you. To date, we have had 40,000 people attend 145 concerts presented by 2,485 professional, world class performers. These and other artists have presented 300 in-school residency events including masterclasses, workshops, and in-school performances to more than 56,000 students and teachers. Since 2002, the Lead Guitar programs have offered free lessons and has provided more than 50 guitars and 35 ukuleles for use in the schools for an estimated 650 students. Our more than forty Leland Wilson in-school Vision Art Masterclasses have reached an estimated 370 students.

The Gold Canyon Arts Festivals have, since 1997 reached an audience of approximately 60,000 persons and have presented hundreds of artists, musicians, and dancers for the enjoyment of these patrons. The grand total of attendees touched by the Gold Canyon Arts Council's programs over the past 24 years has exceeded 160,000.

This year, the GCAC Board has approved new Lifelong Learning in the arts classes for adults. They have also approved the establishment of "Arts for Education" scholarships for high school students.

Sara and I extend our congratulations to Carole Lindemann, GCAC President (2021-2022) and all of the Board Members, past and present for their leadership and forward thinking. It has been a great ride so far. Let's keep up the good work as we conclude this 25th season and begin the journey for the next 25 years.
