## GCAC Board Candidates 2024-2025

Three candidates have been nominated to serve on the GCAC Board of Directors for 2024-2025. Elections will be held at the Annual Business Meeting March 3, 2024. The candidates are:



Ray and Carol retired to Gold Canyon at yearend 2014, became members of the Gold Canyon Arts Council & active as volunteers. They worked in the Philippine electric power industry for 17 years prior to retirement as private developers of renewable & fossil power plants. Ray served as Chairman of the American Association of the Philippines for nine years while located there, a nonprofit formed after WWII to help American resident & visitors in need that remains active. Before his Philippine assignment, Ray served as board member & president of the Fairfield Orchestra, a

symphony orchestra composed of professional musicians from NYC serving residents of Fairfield County, Connecticut.

Ray played the trumpet from elementary school through high school. He was president of the marching & concert bands as well as a member of the Fort Doge (lowa) Symphony Orchestra. He switched to guitar as a freshman at the US Coast Guard Academy, forming a rock band with three classmates that performed regularly at dances until they graduated. Years later he served as chairman of the Academy Alumni Association board of trustees for four years. He began taking classical guitar lessons more than 30 years ago and performs both pop and classical music at senior living facilities & nursing homes.

Ray was appointed to fill the vacancy on the GCAC board in August 2023. Over the past several years he has served as chair of the Grants Committee, organized successful fundraising vents, & acted in liaison capacity with Lead Guitar, which partners with GCAC at schools along the Old West Highway.

Born in Wisconsin, I attended the University of Wisconsin earning a degree in Biochemistry. After moving to Colorado in 1981, I earned enough extra credits to sit for the CPA exam with an eye on eventual self-employment. I worked as a tax accountant and prepared financials for small business until it was time to retire; gratefully a bit early.

I had loved art from my childhood, and in high school had an art teacher who painted life sized figurative commissions. He'd bring them into our class, and I realized that beautiful art is not something confined to

## Leland Wilson School Arts Project 2024

Kate Smith, the Artist in Residence at Cactus Canyon JrHS during the week of January 29<sup>th</sup> through February 2, is a quilt artist and a winter resident of Gold Canyon since 2005. Kate has been quilting since 1977 and developed her interest in applique while living in Honolulu. She spent "many mornings under the Banyon Tree at Mission Museum". Kate enjoys combining

multi-shapes and colors with many techniques.

During the week in Ms. Allison Baumann's 4<sup>th</sup> period art class, Ms. Smith worked with students, designing and painting a "Barn Quilt" with geometric shapes and colors. Students first looked at examples of Barn Quilts and chose a pattern. A grid on a 12 inch square canvas was then drawn by each student. Students learned to "tape off" certain sections to create a hard edge on the shapes to be painted. Students began painting the geometric shapes, choosing colors, and learning to mix colors. Students learned to look at different geometric shapes with a larger grid, use a ruler to measure and calculate and then transfer to a larger square. The students enjoyed the painting part of this project most of all as some found it challenging to be so precise in their calculations and designs.

Assisting Ms. Kate Smith in the classroom was Ms. Gayle Green, also a quilter and retired teacher, and Ms. Kathy Mitchell, a professional artist and a retired art teacher. Kate Smith is a member of Gold Canyon Arts Council and active in quilt guilds in Arizona and Pennsylvania.



As usual, we enjoyed working with the students at Cactus Canyon JrHS and thank Ms. Phyllis Bellemare, Principal and Alison Baumann, art teacher at Cactus Canyon JfHS for inviting us into the school.






















## Gold Canyon Arts Festival 2024-Thanks
